By 1906 the pottery was run by James Tams; it was purchased by the Trenton Potteries Co. in 1921 (Harney 1929).

"The Eagle Pottery was later acquired by the Greenwood China Co. and eventually became a part of 'The Trenton Potteries', a company which operated a group of potteries that concentrated
