Maddock Pottery Company Lamberton Works. The Maddock Pottery Company incorporated in 1892 with an initial stock issue of \$100,000. The Scammell family acquired the Maddock family interest in the Maddock Pottery Company for \$700,000 in 1923 (Hunter Research, Inc. 2003).
