"This company was incorporated July 26, 1881, with C.H. Cook, president, and D.S. Hancock, secretary and treasurer. The works are located between Allen Street and the Belvidere and Delaware Railroad, on the canal. This pottery produces improved C.C. ware, and sanitary and plumber's earthenware. There are two kilns, and seventy-five men are employed" (Woodward and Hageman 1883:694).

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
