NOTES

The pottery was established in 1889 by Cochran & Coxon. In 1889, the Equitable Pottery was operating four kilns (Harney 1929).

"Equitable was founded in 1888 by Andrew Cochran, John Leukel, and Jonathan Coxon. They made sanitary wares and later became part of the Trenton Potteries Company" (Robinson and Feeny 1980:65).
