The Keystone Pottery Company was established in 1890 (Harney 1929).

"Keystone made vitreous china and sanitary specialties beginning c.1892. Company officers included James H. Lyons, J.W. Lyons, Joseph Umpleby, and John Brian" (Robinson and Feeny 1980:75).
